Kelley School - Phase IV

HFI has been involved with the eight phase, two and a half year Kelley School renovation project which removed the old HVAC and plumbing systems. HFI strives to accomplish meeting, or finishing, ahead of the compressed schedule of this project. The magnitude of what had, and has yet to be, accomplished during the summer crunch is a massive amount of manpower being managed in many zones at one time. We are meeting this goal and working into the next phase a little ahead of schedule.

HFI was hired because we have the experience of working the previous project which was the Hodge Hall Addition and it allowed us to have a better grip on knowing the building and people whom we had to work with in the building.

The project was started in December of 2013 and is scheduled for completion in September of 2016. By the end of Summer 2015 we will have replaced the nucleus, or main guts, of the steam, chilled water, hot water heating, and domestic water systems for the building. We will also replace the storm drain systems on various

The opening of Building 2 completes the Corporate Campus for HFI. Building 1 houses the Construction and Industrial Divisions, and the Fabrication Shop. Building 2 houses the Service and Schedule A Departments, Service Repair Shop, Receiving, and Parts Inventory Center. Building 3 is primarily storage for inventory and specific equipment storage. The expansion to Building 2 will allow HFI to better serve our clients. The campus is located at the intersection of Vernal Pike, 11th Street and Adams St. in Bloomington.

He thanked everyone that had confidence in him, especially the late, Bill Cook who gave him "just five minutes, at 6:00 am to ask Mr. Cook for some business." He elaborated how Cook, was very adamant that he "not be late" and when the five minutes was over, he was ushered out of the office. Later that day Joe "received a faxed Purchase Order" that really helped get Harrell Mechanical off the ground and on the map as a mechanical contractor.

Joe's first two employees were his children, Lisa Smith and Mike Harrell. They were both placed in "key trust positions within the company and had it not been for them we wouldn't have survived." He couldn't speak highly enough about how they helped the company moving forward when many other mechanical contracting

companies were failing.



Joe credited Rennie Fish for his willingness to help grow the business. He later bought the company from Joe in December of 1985. and changed the name to Harrell-Fish Inc. in 1998. He also spoke of meeting "a young man with potential in the early 90's that showed a lot of promise. That would be Steve Dawson. I think he's done an outstanding job and I'm very, very proud of him."

Joe reflected on a great career in the mechanical contracting trades. In talking to Joe you can clearly see he continues to be invested in the success of HFI and all employees. He genuinely cares about how HFI influences the community and what HFI can do to be better contributors to the community. He is the epitome of our

Illness	Symptoms	First Aid*
Heat stroke	Confusion Fainting Seizures Excessive sweating or red, hot, dry skin Very high body temperature	Call 911 While waiting for help: Place worker in shady, cool area Loosen clothing, remove outer clothing Fan air on worker; cold packs in armpits Wet worker with cool water; apply ice packs, cool compresses, or ice if available Provide fluids (preferably water) as soon as possible Stay with worker until help arrives
Heat exhaustion	Cool, moist skin Heavy sweating Headache Nausea or vomiting Dizziness Light headedness Weakness Thirst Irritability Fast heart beat	Have worker sit or lie down in a cool, shady area Give worker plenty of water or other cool beverages to drink Cool worker with cold compresses/ice packs Take to clinic or emergency room for medical evaluation or treatment if signs or symptoms worsen or do not improve within 60 minutes. Do not return to work that day
Heat cramps	Muscle spasms Pain Usually in abdomen, arms, or legs	Have worker rest in shady, cool area Worker should drink water or other cool beverages Wait a few hours before allowing worker to return to strenuous work Have worker seek medical attention if cramps don't go away
Heat rash	Clusters of red bumps on skin Often appears on neck, upper chest, folds of skin	Try to work in a cooler, less humid environment when possible Keep the affected area dry
